Just another reminder that these posters need to be laminated and displayed in your HQ, as well as being carried in all First Aid kits

This is part of the ongoing commitment to ensuring the safety and well-being of all our members. These forms are crucial for recording any accidents or incidents promptly and accurately. They will be followed by quarterly reports to the DLV and the District Trustee Board.

County have created a poster for display and use in meeting places and first aid kits. Please follow these steps:

- 1. Print and Laminate
- 2. Attach to First Aid Kits: Securely attach the laminated form to the outside of all first aid bags and boxes used within your group.
- 3. Pin a copy to your meeting place wall
- 4. Include: in all documents for events and camps

Having these forms readily available will help streamline the process of reporting and managing incidents, ensuring County can provide the necessary support and follow-up efficiently. These posters need to be displayed in your HQ, and available to leaders when away from the usual meeting place (in the First Aid kit) NOW. Any near miss or actual incident MUST be reported, no matter how minor.
